

Dog Control Orders

Dog Fouling & The Law

It is an offence to allow a dog, for which you are responsible, to foul and not clear it up immediately. The Dog Wardens have the power to issue fixed penalty notices to members of the public who allow their dog to foul and fail to remove the waste.

What happens if an offence is reported?

The Dog Wardens conduct many patrols but need the public's help as well. As a member of the public reporting dog fouling, we would need the following information in order to consider any formal action:

- A description of the offender, dog and where applicable a registration number if they get in a car
- Location of offence
- Date and time of offence

Whenever possible, enforcement activity will be considered.

Microchipping

The Dog Wardens are able to offer Microchipping for dogs at competitive rates. Microchips are the size of a grain of rice and are easily implanted in the area of your dog's shoulder blade.

On the 1st February 2008 East Lindsey District Council formally adopted new powers that enabled authorised officers to deal with irresponsible dog owners throughout the East Lindsey District Council area.

The new legislation is split into two sections.

Primary Legislation will be enforced by the Council's Dog Warden Services.

Secondary legislation has been made on behalf on Parish and Town Councils.

Persons failing to comply with secondary legislation can be dealt with by Council Dog Wardens but the legislation may be enforced by locally appointed officers who may issue fixed penalty notices to resolve dog related problems.

The new dog control orders have three seasonal dog exclusion areas in the primary legislation. These areas are located at:

- Skegness
- Sutton on Sea
- Mablethorpe

Maps are available to assist residents and visitors to comply with the new legislation. The Seasonal Dog Exclusion areas run from 1st May - 30th September.
