The third Lincoln Jazz Festival weekend takes place in Lincoln's spectacular Cathedral on 19th/20th/21st July, 2024. This historic landmark once again plays host to leading national and international jazz musicians, continuing the Cathedral's centuries-old tradition of celebrating live music.

New Jazz5 and Jazzpac have curated an exciting range of jazz styles and personalities, combining ticketed and free-to-enter events. They include Friday night's opening by the James Taylor Quartet in the Nave, a Jazz Carnival parade featuring local school children in the Cathedral grounds, performances by Italian guitarist Antonio Forcione, New York-based vibes player Joe Locke, world-renowned saxophonist Tim Garland, Lincoln's own pianist Tom Cawley plus the festival's Artistic Director trombonist Dennis Rollins MBE in the Cathedral's stunning Chapter House.

## JAMES TAYLOR QUARTET

For nearly four decades, the James Taylor Quartet has set the standard for the coolest sounds in live, funky Hammond organ-driven jazz, through dozens of albums and legendary live gigs. In a career embracing jazz, soul, rock, funk, classical orchestration and cathedral organs James's fascination for classic detective and action movie soundtracks saw him contribute 'Austin's Theme' for the Austin Powers film franchise, while their 'Starsky & Hutch' theme treatment was a club hit. Appearing with everyone from the Pogues, U2 and Manic Street Preachers to Tom Jones, James still sings in his local Rochester Choral Society and has a separate life as a psychotherapist! Expect a treat from this scintillating band.

The brilliant vocalist Hattie Whitehead assimilates Mitchell's distinctive vocal and guitar-playing but in her own style, supported by guitarist Pete Oxley and a superb band for an emotional festival finale.
